PSALM 34:1-10 NLT

- ³Come, let us tell of the LORD's greatness; let us exalt his name together.
- ⁴I prayed to the LORD, and he answered me. He freed me from all my fears.
- ⁵Those who look to him for help will be radiant with joy; no shadow of shame will darken their faces.
- ⁶ In my desperation I prayed, and the LORD listened; he saved me from all my troubles.
- ⁷ For the angel of the LORD is a guard; he surrounds and defends all who fear him.
- ⁸Taste and see that the LORD is good. Oh, the joys of those who take refuge in him!
- ⁹ Fear the LORD, you his godly people,
- for those who fear him will have all they need.
- ¹⁰ Even strong young lions sometimes go hungry,

PHILIPPIANS 2:1-11 NLT

¹Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from his love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate? ²Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose. ³Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. ⁴Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too. ⁵ You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had. ⁶Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. ⁷Instead, he gave up his divine privileges; he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, 8 he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross. ⁹Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest Honor and gave him the name above all other names, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

¹¹ and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
