

(Reflections from the sermon on January 24, 2016)

"The Lord was with Joseph, so he succeeded in everything he did..."

Genesis 39:2 NLT

No doubt, Joseph was a typical adolescent and teenage boy; full of bravado and confidence. He bragged about his dream of superiority over his brothers and the brothers were very tired of hearing about it. Not that the other 10 brothers (Benjamin was not old enough) didn't have enough to hate him but their father loved Joseph more than the others and had demonstrated his preference by cloaking him with a very colorful coat.

When Genesis 37 opens as "the story, or account, of Jacob and his family," the very next sentence starts with the name, Joseph. You cannot speak of Jacob, who would was re-named Israel by God (Gen. 35:10), without speaking of his favorite son, Joseph, and all his experiences.
