

## 6 - Establishing A Healthy, Productive Identity

(Reflections from the sermon on February 7, 2016)

"I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have **no other gods** before me. You **shall not make** for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; ... You **shall** not misuse the name of the LORD you God, ... Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. ... Honor your father and your mother... You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house... wife... or his ...servants, his ox or donkey, or **anything** else"

Exodus 20:1-17

God brought His people out of 400 years of inhumane treatment – mistreated as slaves. He witnessed a cultural ignorance in this battered and isolated people as well. Having freed them, He also humbled them to be a people of submission to His will and way – to be a Holy Nation, an example to the world of God's love and provision. So, He gave them, for the first time, a set of rules to establish a discipline and within His guidelines.

God has called people today out of the bondage of sin into a time of humble submission to His care and provision through Jesus, His Son. He has written and new law on our hearts through the indwelling Holy Spirit – to be a "royal priesthood", "shining stars in a dark world", a people of faith believing and trusting in His will and way for our life. But, like the Israelites, He needs us to be a healthy, productive people so He can make a difference in this world through us, His Body – the Body of Christ.
