## (Reflections from the sermon on Sunday – April 17, 2016) 2 – Act #1: Radical Hospitality

For the Father judges no one, but has committed all judgment to the Son." John 5:22 NIV

"If anyone hears my words but does not keep them, I do not judge that person. For I did not come to judge the world, but to save the world. <sup>48</sup> There is a judge for the one who rejects me and does not accept my words; the very words I have spoken will condemn them at the last day.

## John 12:47-48 NIV

Judgmental: (definition by Merriam-Webster): tending to judge people too guickly and critically.

Synonyms – captious, carping, caviling, faultfinding, hypercritical, critical, overcritical.

- 1. Have you ever felt undue judgment from someone? How did that make you feel? How did you feel about the person who made that judgment?
- 2. Have you ever felt that the church has been judgmental? Please explain.
- 3. The church has a solid reputation for acting as judge and jury over our individual differences. If much of the world (87% of Americans)<sup>i</sup> feels church people are judgmental then what are we doing to give them that impression?



Researchers say 91% of Americans say they believe in God<sup>ii</sup>, 88% say faith is important<sup>iii</sup>, and the large majority (64%) says they are open to pursuing their faith in an environment different from a typical church<sup>iv</sup>. People want God, just not the way the church packages Him.

Here are six basic needs of Americans<sup>v</sup>:

- a. The need to believe life is meaningful and has a purpose.
- b. The need for a sense of community and deeper relationships.
- c. The need to be listened to and to be heard.
- d. The need to feel one is growing in faith.
- e. The need to be appreciated and respected.
- f. The need for practical help in developing a mature faith.
