

(Reflections from the message on Sunday – June 26, 2016)


"'Can anyone hide from me in a secret place?

Am I not everywhere in all the heavens and earth?' says the LORD."

Jeremiah 23:24 NLT

There are a lot of metaphors or similes used to describe the totality of God – One in three persons. Sunday morning we mentioned a few; the egg, the apple, fire (smoke – flame – ash), water and a pretzel). The symbol above in the header (not the word "God") is widely recognized as representative of the Trinity.

Here is a model of the Trinity. Take a few minutes and look it over. Make notes on what you like or dislike about it. How does this match or miss the mark of how you identify God represented in distinctly three persons?



What do you know about God? How is He described in Scripture?

Remember, attributes of God are not what we attribute to Him, but what He reveals to us about His nature.
