When it comes to parenting, I find this middle place extremely uncomfortable, because I know what childhood and

adolescence were like before the internet, but all my parenting models came from that era...

Technology wins the prize for being the trickiest parenting challenge I have faced...

To summarize – What we are doing is unprecedented – no study yet knows exactly what this iChildhood will look like when our children are full grown people.

So,

1. we have no proven answers to the questions parents have on this issue;
2. And, the questions are evolving faster than the researchers can respond.

Dr Richard Freed (a psychologist & author) is a leader in the field of parenting in the digital age.

He emphasizes that the essence of healthy childhood is found in children whose lives center around family and school (I.e. “Personal support and valid community experiences”)

Here are basic guidelines from this field of researchers:

Set up a plan for moderation – Parents should be the ultimate model

- a. Limit time according to age
- b. Use parental controls on all devices
 - i. Seek advise from the front-line people who are working on behalf of parents
- c. www.pewresearch.org/internet search for “how teens and parents navigate screen time.

Encourage helpful usage

Monitor Activity (accountability)

Know the Real Enemy

Ephesians 6:12-18 msg

And put them to use so you will be able to stand up to everything the Devil throws your way. This is no afternoon athletic contest that we’ll walk away from and forget about in a couple of hours. This is for keeps, a life-or-death fight to the finish against the Devil and all his angels.

Be prepared. You’re up against far more than you can handle on your own. Take all the help you can get, every weapon God has issued, so that when it’s all over but the shouting you’ll still be on your feet.

Truth, righteousness, peace, faith, and salvation are more than words. Learn how to apply them. You’ll need them throughout your
